

Class Description:

English 9 aims to prepare students for the real-world application of their language arts skills as they transition from their first year in high school to sophomore high school year. This curriculum will help prepare them for their career path of either college or vocational education. Students will participate in engaging new and innovative curriculum designed by the ELA department and HMH publishing. Students will have the opportunity to experience an instructional design that includes whole class learning, peer collaboration, and independent learning. Students will be issued texts and consumable workbooks. They will have access to an online learning platform.

They will employ the AP Quotation Sandwich Writing Model for the majority of their writing activities and assignments. Their papers will follow MLA formatting rules for formatting and sourcing their work. They will be required to complete a lengthy research assignment as well.

Class content includes both fiction and nonfiction text and will engage students in the following themes (reading selections will be primarily from the HMH textbook):

CLASSROOM GUIDELINES

Many of the daily assignments given in this course are designed to be completed in class. Assessments, including quizzes and tests, will cover reading, vocabulary, grammar and writing content. Interventions

will be put in place should the student need additional assistance for success in the classroom. Essay deadlines are firm and are given well in advance; students are expected to arrange to submit your essay on the due date if you are absent. The Extended Learning Opportunity program will be used effectively and consistently to ensure that you turn in your assignments. Submitting late work will result in a deduction of your grade. Late projects/essays will be deducted 5% each day after the deadline. All other late assignments will automatically be deducted by 30%. Assignments submitted more than three days late, or after the issuance of one or more ELOs, may be deducted by 50%. Excessively late assignments may no longer be eligible for credit.
